U.S. Open – Drug Testing Process

Compliance with the drug testing program is a condition of entry to the championship. Any player who refuses to participate in the testing process may be disqualified and subject to sanctions.

Drug testing at the U.S. Open will be administered in cooperation with the PGA Tour's Anti-Doping Program.

- The list of **Prohibited Substances and Methods** is contained in Section 5 of the Manual.
- The **Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE)** process is addressed in Section 6 of the Manual.
- **All TUE requests must be submitted to the PGA TOUR no later than five (5) days after having been notified that you have been accepted into sectional qualifying, or within ten (10) days of having received an exemption to play in the U.S. Open Championship.**
