Local Rules

Tees & Handicaps: Men will play from the **BLUE tees**, Senior Men (55 and Over) will play from the **WHITE tees**, unless you notified the committee before event that you wanted to move back and Women will play from the **RED tees**.

* Handicaps are adjusted according to the tee you play from.

** The handicap being used is from your June 9th index.

Format: The **two** lowest scores for each team will be added together for each hole. The lowest 18 hole total team score will be the winner. Prizes will be awarded for gross & net winners. We will be mailing out gift cards after the event.

Out of Bounds: is defined by the inside edge of white stakes, boundary fences and white lines. If a ball goes out of bounds and comes to rest on another part of the course, it is still considered out of bounds.

Alternative to Stroke and Distance – When a player's ball has not been found (lost ball) or is known or virtually certain to be out of bounds, the player may proceed as follows rather than proceeding under stroke and distance. For two penalty strokes, the player may take relief by dropping the original ball or another ball as described in Model Local Rule E-5.

Penalty Areas: Penalty areas are marked as either red or yellow. When stakes or flags and lines are used to mark penalty areas, the stakes or flags *identify* penalty areas, and lines *define* them.

Ground Under Repair: Defined by white lines. French drains and cultivated flower and shrubbery beds on the course are ground under repair even if not so marked. If your ball comes to rest in one of these areas, you must take GUR relief by dropping a ball in a relief area that is one-club length and **is NO closer to the hole – with NO Penalty.**

Accidental Movement of a Ball on Putting Green – There is **no penalty** if the player, opponent or another player in stroke play accidentally moves the player's ball or ball-marker on the putting green. The player must replace the ball on its original spot or place a ball-marker to mark that original spot. Rule 13.1d

Official Score Card: Each team will be keeping score electronically and that will be their official score card. Please go to the scoring area as quickly as possible after completing your final hole to verify your score with MGA staff.

GHIN Posting: Your score will be posted to your handicap record by the MGA following the tournament, please don't post your own score.

Awards & Tiebreaking Procedure: The MGA Member Day committee breaks ties by matching cards to determine the winner on the basis of the lowest score for the back nine holes. If the tying players have the same score for the back nine, the winner is determined on the basis of the last six holes (holes 13-18), last three holes (holes 16-18) and finally the eighteenth hole.
